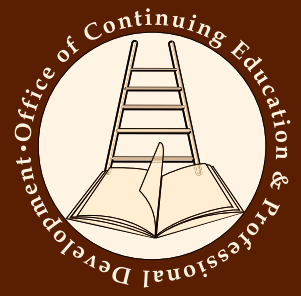

Postgraduate Certificate in Clinical Supervision

The Postgraduate Certificate in Clinical Supervision is designed to provide in-depth training for clinicians to help boost their ability to provide insightful clinical supervision. The program addresses numerous issues that arise during the process, including the supervisory relationship, therapeutic use of self, cultural context, and ethical and legal issues. Additionally, the program will address different supervisory models to help participants identify and develop a style that is conducive to promoting a positive and inspiring supervisory relationship.

Participants in this program will bring cases to discuss and will have an opportunity to learn both theoretical and practical applications of ideas and practice models. The curriculum is designed to offer core content as well as integrative seminars where students will work collaboratively to support each other in developing highly effective skills in clinical supervision. Students will attend 18 seminars and 4 workshops, and complete a capstone project to obtain their certificate.

Program Objectives

- Improve clinical practice of clinicians working with individuals, families, and couples.
- Learn techniques for effective clinical supervision.
- Participants will focus on the challenges, issues, and dilemmas that shape their work as clinical supervisors.
- Acquire a deeper understanding of the theories, values, and principles that inform effective clinical supervision.
- Supervisors will refine their skills for developing capable practitioners and professional leaders.

Who Should Apply

Mental health practitioners or supervisors who are providing supervision or training to other providers of direct or clinical service to different populations. This program is appropriate for all Social Workers, mental health counselors, psychologists, and family therapists.



Program Components

Participants must attend **18 seminars** and **four workshops**.

The Core/Integrative Seminar: This is an ongoing course that focuses on various concepts in supervision such as “use of self” and “parallel process” throughout the course. In addition, models of supervision will be examined and supervision as a developmental process will be explored. A variety of other aspects of supervision will be addressed throughout these sessions. The second component is an ongoing case conference/consultation where participants will bring case material from their own practice experience to help understand and synthesize the knowledge gained throughout the program.

The Core/Integrative Seminars will meet on Monday evenings for three hours approximately two or three times a month from September through June.
