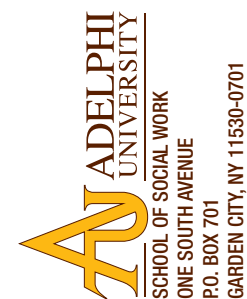

Substance Abuse in Children and Adolescents: Signs and Symptoms

Date: Friday, January 11, 2008

This workshop will focus on child and adolescent substance use and abuse. The instructor will identify current trends including the use of heroin, designer drugs, inhalants, and psychedelics. Characteristic behavioral changes seen when there is substance use in children and adolescents will be examined. Various approaches to implementation of prevention and treatment strategies will also be discussed. An emphasis will be placed on identifying resources and educational information that can be shared with both parents and clinicians working in prevention and treatment with this population.

About the Instructor

Michael Katz, M.Ed., LCSW, is a dynamic counselor, coach, and educator. Using multimedia training materials with clients in personal coaching situations, "in-service-training" workshops, and in "Training of Trainers" programs, he brings his warmth and sense of humor to workshops and training programs at local, county, state, and national levels. Ethics and Liability in Clinical Supervision

This interactive workshop will focus on the major legal and ethical issues involved in clinical supervision. There will be opportunities to explore accepted standards and accountability. The impact of legal requirements on the clinical relationship will be explored. Through presentation of current research and case studies, models of ethical decision making as well as guidelines for risk management will be discussed. Knowledge of the various models will increase awareness regarding supervision, ethics, and liability.

Chemical Dependency from a Family Systems Perspective

This workshop will focus on addiction from a family systems perspective and examine the ways in which family functioning serves to maintain the disorder. As chemical dependency is recognized as a family disease, treatment providers must view the addicted individual within the context of the family system. Circular causality, family hierarchy, and parental conflict will be explored as contributory factors. Characteristics of the chemically dependent family and clinical techniques will be demonstrated through videotaped case presentations. Means of increasing the family's awareness and ability to impact change will be discussed.

About the Instructor

Dan Minuchin, LMFT, is a licensed marriage and family therapist and a senior faculty member at the Minuchin Center for the Family. He has provided consultation and training for work with families to a variety of service providers including foster care, residential treatment, chemical dependency, psychiatric, and home-based treatment. Mr. Minuchin is a member of the American Association for Family Therapy and an AAMFT-approved supervisor.

What Is Cultural Competency and How Does It Impact the Supervisory Relationship?

Using both experimental and theoretical approaches, broad themes of cultural competency will be covered as they relate to ethnicity, race, gender, age, sexual orientation, religious affiliation, physical and mental ability, and social class. Through the use of small and large group exercises, participants will begin to recognize the assumptions, attitudes, biases, and misconceptions that inhibit communication about cultural differences within the supervisory relationships. Factors that facilitate cultural awareness and competence, and a framework for their inclusion in supervision will be provided. The importance of this heightened awareness for improving the quality of supervision and in turn, treatment will be discussed.

About the Instructor

Patricia O'Dell, LCSW, is the clinical coordinator and supervisor of the Adult and Family Treatment Program at Family Service of Morris County in Morristown, NJ, and maintains a private practice. Previously she worked at Rutgers University, School of Social Work, where she taught numerous graduate-level courses and served as assistant dean and director of field education. She has given many workshops and presentations for NASW and other professional groups on a variety of topics including clinical supervision, ethics, and cultural competency. She is a contributing author of the book, *Learning to Teach, Teaching to Learn*, published by CSWE.

Promoting Resilience and Recovery: Group Work with Adult Survivors of Childhood Trauma

This workshop will focus on the use of groups for clients with histories of childhood trauma. Understanding the unique benefits of group treatment for this population and the relative merits of different types of groups will be examined. The stages of group development and common group themes in the beginning, middle, and ending phases of treatment will be identified. A detailed discussion of the role and tasks of the group worker will be included. Common obstacles to growth and change, as well as challenges to the worker such as transference, counter-transference, and indirect trauma, will also be identified and discussed.

About the Instructor

Carolyn Knight, Ph.D., M.S.W., is a professor of social work at the University of Maryland School of Social Work, Baltimore County. Dr. Knight is a licensed social worker with 20 years of experience working individually and in groups with adult survivors of childhood sexual abuse. She is the author of *Working with Adult Survivors of Childhood Trauma: Strategies and Skills for Helping Professionals* and *Process-Oriented Group Therapy for Adult Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse*, as well as numerous articles on working with childhood trauma survivors.
